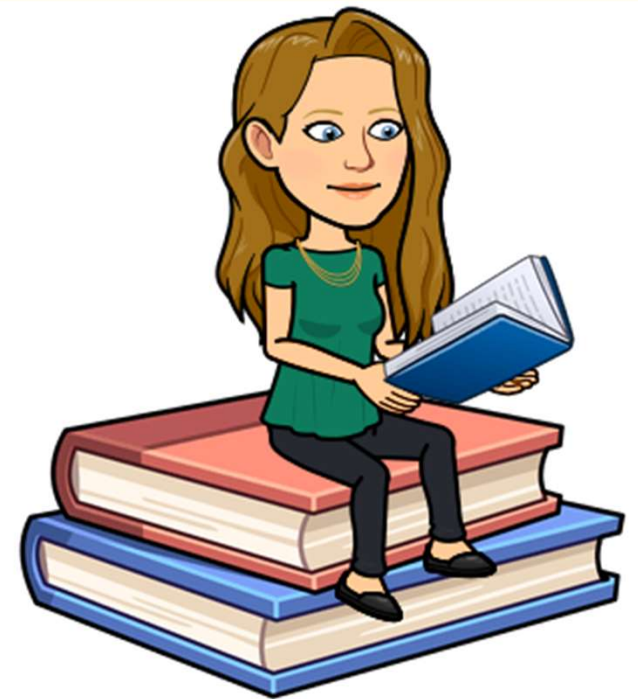
Objectives
